

THE IMPORTANCE OF THE WORDS OF OUR MOUTH

- We must realise how important every word is that comes out of our mouths.
 - The words of your mouth have control over your life, whether you like it or not, or whether you believe it or not.
 - To control your mouth, you must control your mind.
 - Right and wrong thinking is the basis for controlling your words. Prov. 23:7 “As a man thinketh in his heart, so is he”.
 - How do you begin to think?
 - Where does your thinking start?
 - The answer is, your thinking starts with thoughts.
 - There are three places from which we receive thoughts.
1. Thoughts come from your five senses. Everything you have learned since you were born into this world, everything your mind has learned, has entered through your five senses. Therefore, we know that thoughts come through your five senses, either from your present environment, or what you have stored in your subconscious. You might just do nothing one day and a thought hits you. That thought could be from something you have learned a long time ago. It is in your subconscious. That is one way a thought can come.
 2. A thought can come from the devil. Satan can bombard your mind with thoughts. We know this because the scripture supports it. John 13:2 “The devil put the thought of betrayal into Judas’ mind”. The Bible says the devil put the thought of betrayal into his mind. We see then, that your thinking upon a particular line of reasoning can be started by the devil placing a thought in your mind. He cannot read our minds, but only attack it, place the thought and see what you are going to do with it.
 3. God can also put thoughts into your heart by His Holy Spirit. Now, the main difference between thoughts that come from the five senses and the thoughts that come from God is this: God deals with the spirit and the other deals with your mind. Romans 8:7 says that the natural mind alone or the sensual part of you cannot know God. God speaks to you through your spirit and your spirit speaks to your mind.
- Let us look at a few scriptures about our words that come out of our mouth.

“If any man among you seem to be religious, and bridled not his tongue, but deceiveth his own heart, this man’s religion is vain. (James 1:26)

“Pleasant words are as an honeycomb, sweet to the soul, and health to the bones” (Proverbs 16:24).

“The heart of the righteous studieth to answer; but the mouth of the wicked poureth out evil things” (Proverbs 15:28).

“A man hath joy by the answer of his mouth; and a word spoken in due season, how good is it” (Proverbs 15: 23)

“There is that speaketh like a piercing of a sword; but the tongue of the wise is health” (Proverbs 12:18).

“The tongue of the just is as choice silver; the heart of the wicked is little worth” (Proverbs 10:20).

“For he that will love life, and see good days, let him refrain his tongue from evil, and his lips that they speak no guile” (1 Peter 3:10).

“The mouth of a righteous man is a well of life” (Proverbs 10:11).

“I will give you a mouth and wisdom, which all your adversaries shall not be able to gainsay nor resist” (Luke 21:15). This is a good scripture to ask the Lord to let it be true in your life.

“A wholesome tongue is a tree of life; but perverseness therein is a breach in the spirit” (Proverbs 15:4).

- We can then make use of the tongue in positive confess and possess:

I confess “Jesus as my Lord” (Romans 10:9-10): I possess salvation.

I confess that “with His stripes we are healed” (Isaiah 53:5): I possess healing.

I confess that “the Son has made me free” (John 8:36) I possess absolute freedom.

I confess that “the Love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Spirit” (Romans 5:5): I possess the ability to love everyone.

I confess that “the righteous are bold as a lion” (Proverbs 28:1): I possess lion-hearted boldness in spiritual warfare against the devil.

I confess that “He had said, I will never leave thee nor forsake thee” (Hebrews 13:5): I possess the presence of God each step of my way.

I confess that I am “the redeemed of the Lord” (Psalm 107:2): I possess redemption benefits every day.

I confess that the anointing of the Holy One abideth in me (1 John 2:27): I possess yokedestroying results by His anointing.

I confess that in the Name of Jesus I can cast out devils (Mark 16:17): I possess the authority for dynamic deliverance.

I confess that I can lay my hands on the sick and they will recover (Mark 16:18) I possess healing power for those oppressed by sickness.

I confess that my God shall supply all of my needs (Philippians 4:19) I will lack for nothing since I possess God’s abundant supply.

- God says in Malachi 3:6 “I am the Lord, I change not. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, and to day, and for ever (Hebrews 13:8).
- There is a miracle in your mouth, you must speak it!

- The miracle is there on your tongue.
- It is in your mouth.
- The promise of God is there.
- The God who cannot lie has given us many promises.
- Dare to speak those promises out loud:
- Say them to yourself.
- Say them to the devil.
- Say them to sickness.
- Say them to your mountain of trouble.
- Confess them in the face of all contrary evidence.
- Say them while the pain is there.
- Say them while you are so sick you can hardly think.
- God is smiling down on you.
- He delights for you to “put Him in remembrance” of His Word.
- The Lord surely make His promises come true in your life.
- When we say and confess His Word, He brings the miracle to pass.
- Read threw the Bible, right down promises and proclaim it!
- **DO NOT BE HUNG BY YOUR TONGUE.**
- Speak life.
- Let God use your tongue to bring forth good things.
- Don't just be a child of God on your way to heaven.
- Be a world changer!
- Be a history (HIS STORY) maker!
- Be a vesel of honour for Gods Kingdom!
- Don't judge people by their relatives.
- Don't admire people for their wealth but for the creative and generous ways they put it to use.
- An eternal reward in heaven given to you by the Father is far better than a handshake and a pat on the back here on earth.
- Earned authority will always be greater and more effective than merely appointed authority.
- Let us realise who we are in Christ and act like it.
- Once we realise where we are going, we will have the vision to finish the appointed course.
